PRINCIPAL CORNER

On behalf of the students and staff at Denver Online High School, I'd like to wish everyone a Happy New Year! As we venture into 2017, our team at Denver Online is busy enrolling new students, building schedules, and preparing for the next chapter of the school year. With major events like Planning for Success (2/25), testing (March/April), and graduation (May) approaching, it is hard not to stay incredibly busy. In addition to all of this, Denver Online is leading an effort aligned to Denver Public Schools' whole-child support efforts - engaging our staff, students, and parents in a semester of learning and action against a common enemy in our community - anxiety. A significant number of our students report enrolling at Denver Online due to the anxiety (and related disorders) that have plagued them for years surrounding anxiety. While a change in school placement can help, without proper treatment and support, we may not be effective in addressing the root of the problem.

According to the Anxiety and Depression Association of America, at least forty million adults suffer from some type of anxiety disorder including general anxiety, panic, social anxiety, phobias, obsessive-compulsive, post-traumatic stress, major depressive or some other related disorder that started at around age thirteen. Anxiety also affects one in eight children, with negative effects such as poor school performance, missing out on important social experiences, and possibly engaging in substance abuse. While anxiety and related disorders are highly treatable, it can be difficult to ensure that someone who suffers from anxiety actually seeks out and engages with treatment plans in a sustained manner that leads to positive results.

To assist our anxious students and their families in successfully accessing the resources needed to overcome this disorder, Denver Online staff is taking the following actions this semester:

* Since last spring, our team has been working with Dr. Scott Cypers, a mental health professional affiliated with Children's Hospital Colorado at the Anschutz Medical Center. Last year, Dr. Cypers delivered a powerful workshop at our annual Planning for Success event and has been advising our mental health team, as well as a few of our families, since making the connection. It is wonderful to have him advising us on this journey.

* Over the past two weeks, our entire team has engaged in a training in partnership with the Denver Office of Behavioral Health entitled Trauma Informed Systems of Care Training/ Trauma Informed Improvement Plans. Our hope is that this will lead to improved methodologies and messaging to families from our staff about the resources we have available for students suffering from anxiety.

* Over the next two months, Denver Online staff and parents will participate in a book study designed to help us coordinate our efforts in combating the forces of anxiety affecting our students. We will use the book, *Anxious Kids, Anxious Parents: 7 Ways to Stop the Worry Cycle and Raise Courageous & Independent Children* by Reid Wilson and Lynn Lyons, as the anchor for our discussions during a 4-part series beginning February 9. We will meet each Thursday from 5:00-7:00 p.m. until March 2. We are committed to purchasing a book for all families who are interested. Our social workers are reaching out by phone and email. Our hope is that this group may kick-off a monthly support group for parents wishing to continue this work.


* Once we have grounded our staff and parents in this work, we plan to offer our students who experience anxiety a variety of school and community-based resources as a means of fighting back against what can be a debilitating disorder. We will begin the student groups on a weekly basis during home room on Connection Days in March. In these sessions our Social Workers will be leading group discussions on how to identify anxiety, what may trigger it and developing new coping skills to manage anxiety in different settings.

* In addition to the anxiety group, we will also be offering a yoga class on Thursdays from 3:00 - 4:00 p.m. during the fourth quarter that will not only focus on physical well-being, but also as a support for students to find a mental balance following the anxiety discussions. More details will be provided as we approach the fourth quarter of the school year. Anxiety disorders are paralyzing for students and their families as it can derail even the child with the highest potential from achieving his or her

dreams. It can control their daily lives and lives of those who care about them the most.

Anxiety disorders also often co-occur with other disorders such as depression, eating disorders, and attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder (ADHD). The message is that anxiety is a major concern for our students and their families at Denver Online and we are committed to helping our community address it. To that end, our team, in partnership with Denver Public Schools, the Denver Office and Behavioral Health, Children's Hospital of Colorado, and our families are having the conversations and taking the actions necessary to support our students in reaching their goals of overcoming this powerful force. We hope that you will join us in our battle to help our children battle anxiety! Hopefully, we'll see you in February!

Managing Anxiety Group

We would like to invite you to participate in our first **Managing Anxiety** group. This is a book study started and facilitated by our Social Workers here at DOHS, where we are involving the staff, parents and students to help create a solid support system for those of our students who may be struggling with anxiety in school and life.

The book we have chosen to help us guide this work is *Anxious Kids, Anxious Parents: 7 Ways to Stop the Worry Cycle and Raise Courageous and Independent Children* by Reid Wilson and Lynn Lyons. Principal Jones has generously agreed to purchase copies of this book for all staff and families who would like to join this group.

In order to best support our students, we will begin this process by having the staff complete our groups/book discussions, followed by the parent groups and then the student groups during the school day. This way we are making sure each individual group is ready to support the next. Our DOHS staff will be participating in a trauma informed training the first two weeks of January, followed by an in depth analysis of the book. In our discussions, we will be identifying some of the tools/strategies and how we can best adapt them to help our students in the online environment.

Once the staff is fully trained and familiar with the book, we will then begin the groups for parents. Our parent group will begin on **Thursday February 9th from 5-7 PM at Denver Online (4250 Shoshone Street, Denver, CO 80211)** and continue for the following 3 Thursdays through March 2nd. We

understand that you are all very busy with work and families and can appreciate that this may be a lot of time to commit, but we need your support to be successful in this work with your children, our students.


Finally, once we complete the parent groups, we will begin the student groups on a weekly basis during home room on connection days in March. In these sessions our Social Workers will be leading group discussions on how to identify anxiety, what may trigger it and developing new coping skills to manage anxiety in different settings. If the parent group would be interested, we may also establish a monthly parent support group so that we can continue and sustain this work as our interest is helping your child successfully overcome the anxiety that may be keeping them from being successful.

 - Veterans benefits records
 - Food Stamp information (also known as SNAP benefits)
 - * Most recent checking and savings account statement
 - * Most recent business and investment mortgage (not the home in which you and your family live) information, business and farm records, stock, bond, and other investment statements
 - * Parent's date of Marriage/Separation/Divorce (month and year)
