



4-H Lamb Project Scholarship

THE OPPORTUNITY

This is an incredible opportunity for students to get hands-on experience in livestock production. This is a perfect chance for students interested in becoming a vet to get real-world experience, learning about required feeding, vaccinations, and exercise necessary for raising lambs. It is also just a great opportunity to get involved with the amazing 4-H program, meet lots of new friends at The Urban Farm, grow relationships with mentors, and walk away with some college scholarship money!

REQUIREMENTS

- Work at the farm practicing with your animal at least three days a week for at least an hour each time.
- Provide your own transportation to and from The Urban Farm, fairgrounds, and special events.
- Give one presentation to the 4-H club about a livestock topic of your choice.
- Attend all 4-H meetings on the second Saturday of every month in April, May, June, July, and August at 11am at The Urban Farm.
- Participate in 4-H club activities.
- Work closely and communicate often with Denver Online High School Marketing Specialist Kaci Sintek on practicing, planning for weigh-ins and county fair, and any other special event(s) that may arise.
- Attend all events and complete all required materials on the timeline laid out below.
- Man Denver Online High School booth for four hours during the Adams County Fair (if booth is available).

COST TO DENVER ONLINE HIGH SCHOOL

- The lamb (approximately \$150), vaccinations (if necessary), and feed/board (approximately \$30/month) will all be paid for by Denver Online High School.
- 4-H fees and The Urban Farm fees will be paid for by Denver Online High School (\$35 to join 4-H, \$60 membership fee for The Urban Farm).
- 4-H fair project entry fee will be paid for by Denver Online High School (approximately \$30).

COST FOR STUDENT

- You will need to obtain clothing suitable for working with the lambs. This includes clothes to get dirty in and also show clothes. Show clothes must consist of nice jeans, boots or another suitable shoe, belt, and a collared/button-down shirt (all show clothing must be okayed by Kaci Sintek).
- You will need to provide your own transportation to and from all events and activities.
